

Exhibition at Lauritzen/Rush Galleries 2005 Marco Island, FL

The show's featured artists are painter Buchman of Sarasota, sculptor Angelika Kade of Naples and painter Gene Masters of Naples. Buchman, an American,

Buchman, an American, lived and worked for 20 years in Europe, both in Paris and in Copenhagen, Denmark. He settled in Sarasota in 2001.

His paintings are bright abstractions that show his sense of color, balance and musicality.

"Harmony is my keynote," he says of his paintings.
"Ideas from the realm of music are my main source of inspiration."

He also is influenced by

European modernism of the early 20th century, artistic philosophy and methods of Chinese and Japanese painting, and Renaissance and classical

concepts.

Born and raised in Germany, Kade started her career in fashion design there. Her curiosity for anything artistic pulled her into different fields—jewelry design, silk painting, large-scale acrylics and mixed media—but stone sculpting received her full
