He attended the Cornell University School of Fine Arts and Boston University School of Liberal Arts and holds bachelor's and master's degrees in music from the New England Conservatory of Music. Buchman says of his work: "Harmony is my keynote. Ideas from the realm of music are my main source of inspiration. At the same time, a broad spectrum of ideas and techniques of European Modernism of the early 20th century, the artistic philosophy and methods of Chinese and Japanese painting, as well as Renaissance and classical concepts, all provide some bearings for my ongoing voyage into uncharted territory."
