Recently, a class of second graders were given the challenge of writing a poem using the five senses to describe color. Mixed media came into play as they illustrated with magazine clippings while working on their own drawings. They had fun thinking about what a color "smells" or "sounds" like. We have bold figurative and abstract pieces that use one base color and highlight other hues to enhance their inventiveness.

After researching what establishes color, I realized it has to do with the property of light. Light can change the hue of color as well as enhance the richness of mediums used, hence "Chroma." This is the property of light that allows us to visualize color or we would be in total darkness. ABOUT THE DEBBIE DICKINSON GALLERY

Debbie Dickinson established her gallery in 2010 with the promotion and curation of over eighty art shows throughout New York, Nantucket, The Hamptons, Palm Beach, Wynwood, Paris and Art Basel Week in Miami Beach. This exhibition marks her third Art Exhibition as Gallerist. Her efforts have been recognized by ChaShaMa organization in support of the inaugural location of the gallery. Her first location was 2,600 square feet of retail space on 23rd Street in the Chelsea Arts District, the second location was on 14th street at Union Square. Historic from 1975 through the late '90s, Dickinson travelled the globe working as a supermodel and then collaborated with international artists and fashion designers as sales agent and consulting/curating on major projects. This will mark a second chapter for her in the arts as she continues to have an iconic international supermodeling and acting career, as muse for designers, directors, and photographers.
